



Dear Mr. Medina:

I am in receipt of your June 18th email requesting information regarding the potential White Pines Water System improvements. The following summarizes your questions and the DuPage County responses:

1) *Does DuPage County own the water mains in the White Pines Subdivision?*

DuPage County does not own, operate or maintain the White Pines Subdivision watermains.

2) *Provide a copy of the DuPage County water bill rates?*

The most recent billing rates/components for metered DuPage water customers are as follows:

DuPage County Water Charges: \$9.85 (per 1000 gallons)

Water Commission Capital Buy-In-Fee: \$0.73 (per 1000 gallons)

Base Charge: \$5.78 per billing cycle

3) *Would the County offer a "pay-as-you-go" option for the watermain improvements?*

As stated previously, DuPage County would be willing to consider a pay-as-you-go option for the watermain improvements. It would still be necessary for the White Pines residents to fund the \$3 to \$4 million in up-front expenses required to bring Lake Michigan water to the subdivision (storage tank, metering facility and IEPA allocation process). The water rates could then be set over the next 10 to 20 years to generate sufficient capital to slowly replace the deteriorating water mains. This scenario would be dependent upon County Board approval.


The DuPage County option is significantly more expensive than the Bensenville option due to the fact that the County would have to build the storage tank and metering station. Bensenville has already constructed these required facilities. The costs of the watermain replacement would be identical between DuPage County and Bensenville. Please refer to our 2016 letter that details the total cost of the watermain improvements. As a general estimate (in 2016 dollars) the \$7.0 million in watermain expenses would be divided among all of the White Pines residents over a 10-20 year period of time. This would be in addition to the \$3 to \$4 million in up-front expenses that would need to be funded by the residents.

4) *What is the term called when you go in front of a judge and receive a ruling on ownership (water system)?*

I would recommend that you discuss this issue with a lawyer. It appears that the term that you are referring to is "adverse possession" in this situation.

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

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

Dear Mr. Summers:

The following is a summary of the DuPage County service option to provide Lake Michigan water to the White Pines Subdivision. This option has been previously provided to the residents of the White Pines Subdivision in 2016 and is also available for review at the following link on the DuPage County website: http://www.dupageco.org/Public_Works/1382.

The DuPage County service option and the Bensenville service option are similar in respect to the pipe replacement component of the project. The water pipes that require replacement or rehabilitation will be identical between the two options. Therefore, the price for this component of the project would be effectively equal. The primary difference between the DuPage County and Bensenville service options would relate to several components that are needed to facilitate the DuPage County option. These would include the following components with their associated pricing estimates:

• Lake Michigan Allocation Request & System Modeling	\$150,000
• DuPage Water Commission Metering Station	\$1,100,000
• Water Storage Tank (350,000 gallons)	\$1,800,000
• <u>Final Design/Construction Management (15% of tower/station)</u>	\$435,000
TOTAL ADDITIONAL EXPENSES (2016 estimate)	\$3,485,000

It should be clearly understood that the \$3,485,000 would be in addition to the cost of the replacement of the watermains throughout the White Pines Subdivision and would need to be adjusted upward to account for price inflation since these 2016 estimates were completed. DuPage County would be willing to consider a pay-as-you-go option with respect to the watermain component of the project, but the additional project components listed above would need to be financed by the residents prior to project initiation.

DuPage County remains willing to pursue this option for the residents of White Pines should they determine this to be their preferred option. As stated previously, they will need to complete a petition from a clear majority of the homeowners within the subdivision requesting that the County move forward on behalf of the residents.

Dear Ms. Mellenthin:

I am in receipt of your September 5th letter officially requesting three distinct DuPage County water service options for consideration by the residents of White Pines Subdivision. The requested service options were as follows (directly quoted from your letter):

Option 1 – A straight “apples to apples” proposal with DuPage taking over the system after full replacement of all water lines and purchasing water from one of our bordering municipalities.

This option includes complete replacement of all lines within the White Pines Subdivision by DuPage County with the water being supplied by the Village of Bensenville to DuPage County.

Option 2 – DuPage takes over the system, replaces, relines, directionally bores or a combination of all water lines and purchases water from one of our bordering municipalities.

This option was not analyzed as it is not possible to determine the viability of rehabilitation of pipes prior to final design.

Option 3 – DuPage takes over the system, constructs a ground level tank and pumping station, replaces, relines, directionally bores or a combination of all water lines and purchases water from the Water Commission for our use.

This option includes the complete replacement of all lines within the White Pines Subdivision by DuPage County, construction of a water tower and metering station. The water will be supplied to DuPage County directly from the Water Commission.

The following summarizes our preliminary findings and cost estimates for each of the requested options.

Option 1

The County assumed identical replacement of pipes as shown by Bensenville. This option was completed in order to show a direct comparison to the Village of Bensenville construction estimate for the watermain replacement project in the White Pines Subdivision. A detailed preliminary cost estimate has been attached for consideration. The following summarizes our estimates and key considerations for the residents of White Pines.

- Pipes will be replaced within the White Pines Subdivision as outlined by the Village of Bensenville option.
- The total DuPage County cost estimate for this option was determined to be \$7,388,062. After factoring in the \$900,000 contribution from the Bensenville Unincorporated Utility Fund, the total cost to the residents of White Pines would be approximately \$6.5 Million.
- It should be noted that approximately \$400,000 of this estimate is related to the estimated 3-year delay in construction that would be required for implementation of this option. This delay is due mainly to the fact that the County would have to initiate the loan process from the beginning with the EPA.
- Assuming that the County can be approved for the low-interest loan from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, a 3.00% interest rate will be incorporated into the cost estimates due to the three year delay in the project. This is higher than the currently projected 2.21% interest rate quoted by the Village of Bensenville. The interest rate fluctuates on a yearly basis and has been on an upward trend over the past several years.
- A total project cost of \$6,488,062, with a 3.00% interest rate for a 20-year loan, would result in a total loan payment (principal plus interest) of \$8,722,000. Considering the 262 homes currently connected to the water service, this would result in a yearly total obligation for the 262 homes of \$436,100. Each home would be responsible for a payment of \$1,664 for the next 20 years, or \$138.71 per month for the loan repayment.
- Residents of White Pines should be aware that this option requires that the County purchase water from a local provider. The County anticipates that Bensenville would likely be the only feasible local provider of the Lake Michigan Water. Obtaining water from other providers would likely add considerable expense to the total project cost, as infrastructure would need to be extended into the subdivision to supply the water. This issue will be further examined during final design.
- If an agreement can be negotiated between Bensenville and DuPage County for the supply of water, it would be anticipated that Bensenville would charge a mark-up for the Lake Michigan water delivered through their system to the new DuPage County water system. At this time, a mark-up of \$2.50 per 1,000 gallons was assumed to be charged by the Village of Bensenville. This constitutes approximately a 50% mark-up from the raw Lake Michigan water rates now being charged by the DuPage Water Commission.
- The estimated DuPage County water bill incorporating the completion of Option #1 has been prepared and shown below. It should be understood that the value shown represents a bi-monthly water charge amount as the County bills customers every two months. All rates shown are current DuPage County rates and are subject to change. The Village of Bensenville will still own, operate and bill for sanitary sewer service within the White Pines Subdivision. The sanitary sewer charge is not included in the chart below.

<u>OPTION #1 - Anticipated DuPage Water Bill (utilizing current rates)</u>	
NOTE: DuPage County Bills Bi-Monthly	
Usage calculated at 4,500 gallons per month (9,000 gallons bi-monthly)	
Water Consumption (2-month period)	9,000 gallons
Base Charge Per Bill (flat charge per bill)	\$ 5.78

Capital Buy-In Fee Charge (\$0.73 per 1,000 gallons)	\$ 6.57

Option 2

The White Pines Civic Association requested that the County examine an option that incorporates a combination of system replacement, relining and directional boring of all water lines within the subdivision as well as the purchase of water from one of the bordering municipalities. The County was not able to complete this option analysis as it requires in-depth analysis of the condition of the existing water system. This level of value engineering typically occurs during the final design phase of a project when detailed condition assessments can be completed.

It should be understood that the County will not allow rear-yard watermain to remain in place. All watermain located within the rear-yard easements will be required to be reconstructed in front of the houses in the right-of-way of the streets. Existing pipes within the road right-of-way would be assessed during the design phase of the project for overall condition, pipe integrity, pipe type and conveyance capacity. Options including relining would then be considered if the pipe is deemed to be in acceptable condition.

Residents should not assume that the relining of pipes will be a feasible alternative that will reduce the overall project expenses when deciding on an acceptable project approach. It should be noted that the potential rehabilitation of watermain within the subdivision would only apply to a portion of the watermain within the subdivision. Therefore, the fiscal impact of this option would not be expected to be substantial.

Option 3

The White Pines Civic Association requested that the County also examine an option that includes taking over the water system, construction of a ground level tank and pumping station, replacement or relining of the same pipes as shown by Bensenville. A detailed preliminary cost estimate has been attached for consideration. The following summarizes our estimates and key considerations for the residents of White Pines.

- As detailed in Option #1, the County has assumed the full replacement of all watermain within the White Pines Subdivision for a comparison to the Village of Bensenville option. Consideration of relining alternatives would occur during the final design phase of the project.

- A ground level tank was requested for this alternative by the White Pines Civic Association. Until very detailed system modeling, site selection, topographic survey and system demands are determined during final design, a standard elevated storage tank was assumed.
- The total DuPage County cost estimate for this option was determined to be \$10,862,555. After factoring in the \$900,000 contribution from the Bensenville Unincorporated Utility Fund, the total cost to the residents of White Pines would be approximately \$10 Million.
- It should be noted that approximately \$760,000 of this estimate is related to the estimated 4-year delay in construction that would be required for implementation of this option. This delay is due mainly to the fact that the County would have to initiate the loan process from the beginning with the EPA. In addition, this option requires a lengthy process from the Illinois Department of Natural Resources to receive Lake Michigan allocation rights.
- Assuming that the County can be approved for the low-interest loan from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, a 3.25% interest rate will be incorporated into the cost estimates due to the four year delay in the project. This is higher than the currently projected 2.21% interest rate quoted by the Village of Bensenville. The interest rate fluctuates on a yearly basis and has been on an upward trend over the past several years.
- A total project cost of \$9,962,555, with a 3.25% interest rate for a 20-year loan, would result in a total loan payment (principal plus interest) of \$13,755,777. Considering the 262 homes currently connected to the water service, this would result in a yearly total obligation for the 262 homes of \$687,789. Each home would be responsible for a payment of \$2,625 for the next 20 years, or \$219 per month for the loan repayment.
- Option #3 allows the County to purchase Lake Michigan water directly from the DuPage Water Commission.
- The estimated DuPage County water bill incorporating the completion of Option #3 has been prepared and shown below. It should be understood that the value shown represents a bi-monthly water charge amount as the County bills customers every two months. All rates shown are current DuPage County rates and are subject to change. The Village of Bensenville will still own, operate and bill for sanitary sewer service within the White Pines Subdivision. The sanitary sewer charge is not included in the chart below.

Summary

This letter has detailed two possible water service alternatives that include the participation by DuPage County. Each option fully replaces the water pipes within the White Pines Subdivision. Option #1 allows DuPage County to receive their water from Bensenville, while Option #3 allows DuPage County to receive their water from the DuPage Water Commission. Residents should fully understand that both of these options are significantly more expensive than the option being presented by the Village of Bensenville. Ultimately, the DuPage County options will cost the White Pines residents more money on a monthly basis than the Village of Bensenville option. In addition, the process of watermain replacement within the White Pines Subdivision would be significantly delayed while the County pursues financing from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency.

Should the residents of White Pines wish to pursue one of the listed DuPage County options, a petition will be required to be signed from a clear majority of the homeowners within the subdivision requesting that the County move forward with a specific option. If the Civic Association is interested in pursuing a petition, the County would request that we assist in the development of the wording for the petition. It will be necessary that the petition include the costs and conditions outlined in this letter. Once the petition is submitted to the County, it will then be presented to the Public Works Committee and County Board for consideration of project approval.

Based on your letter dated April 22, 2016 requesting Illinois America's approach and financial impact of acquiring the White Pines Water System, we are providing the following information for discussion.

Upon review of the available information, our approach and pricing structures are based on two different supply potentials. Each at this time requires assumptions based on current existing conditions and will be defined further herein.

Option 1 – Illinois American Water would acquire the White Pines distribution system and be responsible for operation, maintenance, and all capital improvements. Illinois American Water would purchase water directly from the Village of Bensenville.

Option 2 – Illinois American Water would acquire the White Pines distribution system and be responsible for operation, maintenance, and all capital improvements. Illinois American Water would enter into an interim contract with Bensenville for an approximate period of three years. During that time, Illinois American Water would obtain the necessary approvals, design and build the infrastructure needed to make the modifications to the system to be able to purchase water from the DuPage Water Commission through a direct water connection.

In both instances, all infrastructure improvements would be addressed in the rate structure further described in the following information. The following summarizes our approach and the financial impacts relating to a potential acquisition as well as the potential rate impact to residents.

OPTION 1: Illinois American Water ownership, Village of Bensenville water source

- Illinois American would make an offer of \$150 per customer / connection for the infrastructure owned by the White Pines Civic Association.
- Recommendation would be made that the funds, in Bensenville's unincorporated account allocated for White Pines Infrastructure improvements that residents have been contributing towards, would be refunded back to the residents of White Pines. Estimated balance of this fund is approximately \$1,000,000.
- Illinois American Water would be responsible for negotiations with Bensenville to establish rates for water purchased to be provided to the White Pines residents.
- White Pines residents would be placed on Illinois American Water's Zone 1 Water Tariff.
- Illinois American Water would be responsible for all system improvements within the White Pines service area under the proposed rate structure.
 - As noted in previous discussions, under proposed Bensenville or DuPage ownership the additional costs for system improvements would be the responsibility to White Pines residents. These costs have been in the range of an additional \$98 to \$146 a month to cover the capital costs needed for system improvements under the plans proposed by Bensenville or DuPage County.
 - The impact of the needed infrastructure improvements for White Pines in the case of an Illinois American Water acquisition is greatly reduced due to our ability to spread those costs across our entire tariff group over a period of time moving forward.


The rate structure quoted below is based on the rate request currently pending Illinois Commerce Commission (ICC) approval and would be adjusted accordingly based on the final ruling effective January 2017. This estimate includes purchasing water from Bensenville at a cost of 1.5 times the supply charge based on Bensenville 2016 ordinance rates.

IAWC Water Service Charge based upon meter size (5/8" meter)	\$20.00
Water Usage Charge per 1,000 gallons	\$4.319
Public Fire Protection Charge based upon meter size (5/8" meter)	\$4.55
Bensenville Purchased Water Charge per 1,000 gallons (plus unaccounted for water to the extent permitted by the ICC)	\$10.73

Based on the rate structure currently in place with Bensenville, at closing the increase for the average user of around 4,500 gallons would be approximately \$26.00.

Key assumptions:

- Bensenville would provide water at the defined rate in their existing ordinance - 150% of rates for customers within the Bensenville corporate limits.
- If a lower bulk rate was to be negotiated, those savings would be passed onto White Pines customers.

Option 1: Capital Improvements Approach

Upon acquisition, Illinois American Water would perform a comprehensive planning study of the White Pines water main infrastructure to develop a multi-year capital investment plan to develop a systematic water main placement program for the White Pines service area. Based on Illinois American Water's experience and competitive bidding of water main replacement technologies, we have found horizontal directional drilling to be the most cost effective, and least disruptive approach to replacement of water mains in similar neighborhoods such as White Pines. Each water main replacement project would also include the installation of new services lines from the new main to the customer's home. This approach places Illinois American Water in the position of being able to negotiate a supply contract with Bensenville, and also places Illinois American Water as the entity interfacing directly with Bensenville as the supplier.

OPTION 2: Illinois American Water ownership, interim purchased water from Bensenville - transitioning to DuPage Water Commission as source water in year 4

- Illinois American would make an offer of \$150 per customer / connection for the infrastructure owned by the White Pines Association.
- Recommendation would be made that the funds in Bensenville's unincorporated account, allocated for White Pines infrastructure improvements that residents have been contributing towards, would be an asset transferred to Illinois American Water. The Company would in turn use these funds to offset the cost of necessary infrastructure improvements required to connect to DuPage Water Commission. Estimated balance of this fund is approximately \$1,000,000.
- Illinois American Water would be responsible for negotiations with Bensenville to establish a rates agreement for the interim basis.


- White Pines residents would be placed on Illinois American Water's Zone 1 tariff. Bensenville rates would apply as reflected in Option 1 for the first three years until infrastructure is in place to connect to the DuPage Water Commission water source. Adjustment to the rates from Bensenville source rate of \$10.73 per 1,000 to the DuPage Water Commission rate, currently \$4.80 per 1,000, would be projected in year 4 as shown below.
- Illinois American Water would be responsible for all system improvements within the White Pines service area.
 - As noted in previous discussions, under proposed Bensenville or DuPage ownership the additional costs for system improvements would be the responsibility to White Pines residents. These costs have been in the range of an additional \$98 to \$146 a month to cover the capital costs needed for system improvements under the plans proposed by Bensenville or DuPage County.

The rate structure quoted below is based on the rate request currently pending ICC approval and would be adjusted accordingly based on the final ruling effective January 2017. The rate reduction is the difference in the source water charge from DuPage Water Commission compared to Bensenville source.

Key assumptions:

- Bensenville would provide water at the agreed upon rate in their existing ordinance at the rate of 150% of rates within the Bensenville corporate limits and enter into a short term agreement with Illinois American Water.
- If a lower bulk rate was to be negotiated, those savings would be passed onto White Pines customers.
- Property can be acquired for a site to construct a reservoir or tower to provide the required storage.
- Necessary approvals can be obtained from DuPage Water Commission, ICC, FAA, IEPA, IDNR (Lake Michigan Water Allocation), and other involved agencies.

Option 2: Capital Improvement Approach

This alternative includes the same approach, as Alternative 1, with respect to the water main infrastructure; however, this alternative proposes a change in the source of supply. Illinois American Water would engage the DuPage Water Commission for a direct water connection along Church Rd. Illinois American Water would engineer and construct a new water storage tank and metering station to supply water to the residents of White Pines directly from the DuPage Water Commission. This option assumes a suitable parcel of land can be acquired, and that appropriate zoning variances can be achieved to allow the construction of a water storage structure. While an elevated storage tank would be the preferred method of providing daily use and emergency water storage to White Pines, depending upon land options and local restrictions, a ground storage tank and booster pumps may be necessary.

Under this option, it would, however, be necessary to continue the supply of water to White Pines via the Village of Bensenville; until the infrastructure connection to DuPage Water Commission could be engineered, permitted, approved and constructed. Based on Illinois American Water's discussion with the Commission, the terms of an agreement would require that land for the construction of a water storage tank be secured (with proof of documented land rights provided) prior to the Commission solidifying a final agreement.

As an example of Illinois American Water's commitment to the residents of White Pines, IAW has been in preliminary discussions with the Bensenville Park District (BPD) in regards to potential land options along Church Rd; and has ascertained that the Park District is unable to sell the lands under their jurisdiction. The concept of a potential land lease arrangement was discussed with BPD, of which BPD indicated it would be open to consideration upon receiving an official written proposal to share with its board. The cost effectiveness of a lease arrangement, however, would have to be further evaluate, as a result of an understanding that an existing communication antennae situated on the White Pines golf course property is approximately \$2500 / month. Given the potential of a significant annualized expense for a property lease, Illinois American Water, in partnership with White Pines, would explore other property interest in the area, including potential parcels within the White Pines neighborhood.

Illinois American Water similarly has been in discussion with the DuPage County Forest Preserve in regards to potential land options; and has ascertained that the Forest Preserve cannot legally sell any property, but has the ability to grant easements. A number of the Forest Preserve land options in this vicinity are however reported to be considered ecologically and environmentally sensitive, and likely impractical to build on from a regulatory perspective. Other parcels in the area of White Pines would additionally be explored to further ascertain other land options for prospective siting of a water tank.

The White Pines Civic Association (WPCA) recently requested that DuPage County provide updated and amended county water service options originally provided to the residents of the White Pines Subdivision. Specifically, the Civic Association requested that the County incorporate any new information resulting from the Christopher B. Burke Engineering Study being prepared for the Village of Bensenville. A copy of our updated option analysis has also been included with this letter.

It should be noted that both options being presented are maximum project expense numbers. As stated within the letter to the White Pines Civic Association, both of the DuPage County service options are more expensive than the Village of Bensenville service alternative. This is due primarily to the fact that if the residents select DuPage County as the service provider, the project will be delayed several years as the financing, permits and required intergovernmental agreements are secured. The Village of Bensenville option has already been distributed to the Civic Association and can be found on the Bensenville website at www.bensenville.il.us. Click on the departments tab on the top of the page and the information is under the Public Works option.

Should the residents of White Pines wish to pursue one of the listed DuPage County options, a petition will be required to be signed from a clear majority of the homeowners within the subdivision requesting that the County move forward with a specific option. If residents are interested in pursuing a petition, the county would request that we assist in the development of the wording for the petition. It will be necessary that the petition include the costs and conditions of a specific option. Once the petition is submitted, it will then be presented to the Public Works Committee and County Board for consideration of project approval.



I am in receipt of your April 22, 2016 letter requesting that DuPage County update/amend our original options as submitted in September, 2015 for DuPage County to provide water to the White Pines Subdivision. In this request you have asked DuPage County to change, review, amend, and/or edit such proposals with any and all information resulting from but not limited to the completed Burke study that was shared with the WPCA in March of 2016.

DuPage County has reviewed their initial proposal from September of 2015 and has now developed two distinct options for the consideration of the White Pines residents. These are as follows:

Option 1 – This option follows the recommendations of the Christopher B. Burke (CBBEL) study that was presented in March of 2016 with respect to pipe replacement throughout the White Pines Subdivision. The pipes that are being replaced, relined or will remain in place in this option are identical to the CBBEL recommendations shown in their Exhibit B-1 (included). This option includes the replacement of all existing services within the subdivision. DuPage County would own and operate the system but would purchase water directly from the Village of Bensenville.

Option 2 – This option follows the recommendations of the Christopher B. Burke (CBBEL) study that was presented in March of 2016 with respect to pipe replacement throughout the White Pines Subdivision. The pipes that are being replaced, relined or to remain in place in this option are identical to the CBBEL recommendations shown in their Exhibit B-1 (included). This option includes the replacement of all existing services within the subdivision. DuPage County would own and operate the system, build a new water storage tank and construct a metering station required for a direct connection to the DuPage Water Commission. The County would then purchase the water directly from the Water Commission.

It should be noted that the two options being presented are identical except for the source of the water being provided to the White Pines Association and the specific construction requirements associated with the differing sources of the water.

The following summarizes our preliminary findings and cost estimates for each of the requested options.

Option 1

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- Pipes will be replaced within the White Pines Subdivision as shown on CBBEL Exhibit B-1 (included).
- The total DuPage County cost estimate for this option was determined to be \$7,016,223. After factoring in the \$1,000,000 contribution from the Bensenville Unincorporated Utility Fund, the total cost to the residents of White Pines would be approximately \$6.02 Million.
- It should be noted that approximately \$400,000 of this estimate is related to the estimated 3-year delay in construction that would be required for implementation of this option. This delay is due mainly to the fact that the County would have to initiate the loan process from the beginning with the EPA.
- Assuming that the County can be approved for the low-interest loan from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, a 3.00% interest rate will be incorporated into the cost estimates due to the three year delay in the project. This is higher than the currently projected 2.00% interest rate quoted by the Village of Bensenville. The interest rate fluctuates on a yearly basis and has been on an upward trend over the past several years.
- A total project loan amount of \$6,016,223, with a 3.00% interest rate for a 20-year loan, would result in a total loan payment (principal plus interest) of \$8,087,694. Considering the 230 homes currently connected to the water service (as supplied by Bensenville), this would result in a yearly total obligation for the 230 homes of \$404,385. Each home would be responsible for a payment of \$1,758 for the next 20 years, or \$146.50 per month for the loan repayment (\$293 bi-monthly).
- The estimate being provided includes the replacement of all current water services within the subdivision due to the concern over the possible presence of lead joints in the services. During the final design process it will be determined which services do not contain lead and will remain in place.
- Residents of White Pines should be aware that this option requires that the County purchase water from a local provider. The County anticipates that Bensenville would likely be the only feasible local provider of the Lake Michigan Water. Obtaining water from other providers would likely add considerable expense to the total project cost, as infrastructure would need to be extended into the subdivision to supply the water. This issue will be further examined during final design.
- If an agreement can be negotiated between Bensenville and DuPage County for the supply of water, it would be anticipated that Bensenville would charge a mark-up for the Lake Michigan water delivered through their system to the new DuPage County water system. At this time, a mark-up of \$2.50 per 1,000 gallons was assumed to be charged by the Village of Bensenville. This constitutes approximately a 50% mark-up from the raw Lake Michigan water rates now being charged by the DuPage Water Commission.

- The estimated DuPage County water bill incorporating the completion of Option #1 has been prepared and shown below. It should be understood that the value shown represents a bi-monthly water charge amount as the County bills customers every two months. All rates shown are current DuPage County rates and are subject to change. The Village of Bensenville will still own, operate and bill for sanitary sewer service within the White Pines Subdivision. The sanitary sewer charge is not included in the chart below.

Option 2

This option follows the recommendation of the Christopher B. Burke (CBBEL) study that was presented in March of 2016 with respect to pipe replacement throughout the White Pines Subdivision with DuPage County purchasing the water directly from the DuPage Water Commission. A detailed preliminary cost estimate has been attached that shows the breakdown of expenses as well as the watermains that will be replaced as part of this project. The following summarizes our estimates and key considerations for the residents of White Pines.

- Pipes will be replaced within the White Pines Subdivision as shown on CBBEL Exhibit B-1 (included).
- A ground level tank was requested for this alternative by the White Pines Civic Association. Until very detailed system modeling, site selection, topographic survey and system demands are determined during final design, a standard elevated storage tank was assumed.
- The total DuPage County cost estimate for this option was determined to be \$10,462,244. After factoring in the \$1,000,000 contribution from the Bensenville Unincorporated Utility Fund, the total cost to the residents of White Pines would be approximately \$9.5 Million.
- It should be noted that approximately \$575,000 of this estimate is related to the estimated 3-year delay in construction that would be required for implementation of this option. This delay is due mainly to the fact that the County would have to initiate the loan process from the beginning with the EPA. In addition, this option requires a lengthy process from the Illinois Department of Natural Resources to receive Lake Michigan allocation rights.

- Assuming that the County can be approved for the low-interest loan from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, a 3.00% interest rate will be incorporated into the cost estimates due to the three year delay in the project. This is higher than the currently projected 2.00% interest rate quoted by the Village of Bensenville. The interest rate fluctuates on a yearly basis and has been on an upward trend over the past several years.
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- The estimate being provided includes the replacement of all current water services within the subdivision due to the concern over the possible presence of lead joints in the services. During the final design process it will be determined which services do not contain lead and will remain in place.
- This option allows the County to purchase water directly from the DuPage Water Commission through a metering station connection that will be required to be constructed as part of this option.
- The estimated DuPage County water bill incorporating the completion of Option #2 has been prepared and shown below. It should be understood that the value shown represents a bi-monthly water charge amount as the County bills customers every two months. All rates shown are current DuPage County rates and are subject to change. The Village of Bensenville will still own, operate and bill for sanitary sewer service within the White Pines Subdivision. The sanitary sewer charge is not included in the chart below.


Summary

This letter has detailed two possible water service alternatives that include the participation by DuPage County. Each option follows the pipe replacement plan as presented by Christopher B. Burke Engineering, Ltd. in their presentation to the White Pines Civic Association in March of 2016. Option #1 allows DuPage County to receive their water from Bensenville, while Option #2 allows DuPage County to receive their water from the DuPage Water Commission. Residents should fully understand that both of these options appear to be more expensive than the option being presented by the Village of Bensenville. In addition, the process of watermain replacement within the White Pines Subdivision would be significantly delayed while the County pursues financing from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency. This delay in project completion will likely result in higher interest rates and overall project cost escalation.

Should the residents of White Pines wish to pursue one of the listed DuPage County options, a petition will be required to be signed from a clear majority of the homeowners within the subdivision requesting that the County move forward with a specific option. Typically, this percentage has been required to be at least 60 to 70% of the residents before DuPage County will consider progression of the project. If the Civic Association is interested in pursuing a petition, the County would request that we assist in the development of the wording for the petition. It will be necessary that the petition include the costs and conditions outlined in this letter. Once the petition is submitted to the County, it will then be presented to the Public Works Committee and County Board for consideration of project approval.







As requested, I am working to update our previous DuPage County cost estimates that we provided back in September (see attached). I want to make sure that we are providing exactly what the Civic Association is looking for as part of this request. In your original letter from September, your group had asked for 3 different scenarios. I was wondering if there was a specific scenario that I should be focusing on. These were your original options that you requested:

Option 1 – A straight “apples to apples” proposal with DuPage taking over the system after full replacement of all water lines and purchasing water from one of our bordering municipalities. This option includes complete replacement of all lines within the White Pines Subdivision by DuPage County with the water being supplied by the Village of Bensenville to DuPage County.

Option 2 – DuPage takes over the system, replaces, relines, directionally bores or a combination of all water lines and purchases water from one of our bordering municipalities.


Option 3 – DuPage takes over the system, constructs a ground level tank and pumping station, replaces, relines, directionally bores or a combination of all water lines and purchases water from the Water Commission for our use. This option includes the complete replacement of all lines within the White Pines Subdivision by DuPage County, construction of a water tower and metering station. The water will be supplied to DuPage County directly from the Water Commission:

I am in receipt of your September 5th letter officially requesting three distinct DuPage County water service options for consideration by the residents of White Pines Subdivision. The requested service options were as follows (directly quoted from your letter):

Option 1 – A straight “apples to apples” proposal with DuPage taking over the system after full replacement of all water lines and purchasing water from one of our bordering municipalities.

This option includes complete replacement of all lines within the White Pines Subdivision by DuPage County with the water being supplied by the Village of Bensenville to DuPage County.

Option 2 – DuPage takes over the system, replaces, relines, directionally bores or a combination of all water lines and purchases water from one of our bordering municipalities.

This option was not analyzed as it is not possible to determine the viability of rehabilitation of pipes prior to final design.

Option 3 – DuPage takes over the system, constructs a ground level tank and pumping station, replaces, relines, directionally bores or a combination of all water lines and purchases water from the Water Commission for our use.

This option includes the complete replacement of all lines within the White Pines Subdivision by DuPage County, construction of a water tower and metering station. The water will be supplied to DuPage County directly from the Water Commission.

The following summarizes our preliminary findings and cost estimates for each of the requested options.

Option 1

The County assumed identical replacement of pipes as shown by Bensenville. This option was completed in order to show a direct comparison to the Village of Bensenville construction estimate for the watermain replacement project in the White Pines Subdivision. A detailed preliminary cost estimate has been attached for consideration. The following summarizes our estimates and key considerations for the residents of White Pines.

- Pipes will be replaced within the White Pines Subdivision as outlined by the Village of Bensenville option.
- The total DuPage County cost estimate for this option was determined to be \$7,388,062. After factoring in the \$900,000 contribution from the Bensenville Unincorporated Utility Fund, the total cost to the residents of White Pines would be approximately \$6.5 Million.
- It should be noted that approximately \$400,000 of this estimate is related to the estimated 3-year delay in construction that would be required for implementation of this option. This delay is due mainly to the fact that the County would have to initiate the loan process from the beginning with the EPA.
- Assuming that the County can be approved for the low-interest loan from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, a 3.00% interest rate will be incorporated into the cost estimates due to the three year delay in the project. This is higher than the currently projected 2.21% interest rate quoted by the Village of Bensenville. The interest rate fluctuates on a yearly basis and has been on an upward trend over the past several years.
- A total project cost of \$6,488,062, with a 3.00% interest rate for a 20-year loan, would result in a total loan payment (principal plus interest) of \$8,722,000. Considering the 262 homes currently connected to the water service, this would result in a yearly total obligation for the 262 homes of \$436,100. Each home would be responsible for a payment of \$1,664 for the next 20 years, or \$138.71 per month for the loan repayment.
- Residents of White Pines should be aware that this option requires that the County purchase water from a local provider. The County anticipates that Bensenville would likely be the only feasible local provider of the Lake Michigan Water. Obtaining water from other providers would likely add considerable expense to the total project cost, as infrastructure would need to be extended into the subdivision to supply the water. This issue will be further examined during final design.
- If an agreement can be negotiated between Bensenville and DuPage County for the supply of water, it would be anticipated that Bensenville would charge a mark-up for the Lake Michigan water delivered through their system to the new DuPage County water system. At this time, a mark-up of \$2.50 per 1,000 gallons was assumed to be charged by the Village of Bensenville. This constitutes approximately a 50% mark-up from the raw Lake Michigan water rates now being charged by the DuPage Water Commission.
- The estimated DuPage County water bill incorporating the completion of Option #1 has been prepared and shown below. It should be understood that the value shown represents a bi-monthly water charge amount as the County bills customers every two months. All rates shown are current DuPage County rates and are subject to change. The Village of Bensenville will still own, operate and bill for sanitary sewer service within the White Pines Subdivision. The sanitary sewer charge is not included in the chart below.

Option 2

The White Pines Civic Association requested that the County examine an option that incorporates a combination of system replacement, relining and directional boring of all water lines within the subdivision as well as the purchase of water from one of the bordering municipalities. The County was not able to complete this option analysis as it requires in-depth analysis of the condition of the existing water system. This level of value engineering typically occurs during the final design phase of a project when detailed condition assessments can be completed.

It should be understood that the County will not allow rear-yard watermain to remain in place. All watermain located within the rear-yard easements will be required to be reconstructed in front of the houses in the right-of-way of the streets. Existing pipes within the road right-of-way would be assessed during the design phase of the project for overall condition, pipe integrity, pipe type and conveyance capacity. Options including relining would then be considered if the pipe is deemed to be in acceptable condition.

Residents should not assume that the relining of pipes will be a feasible alternative that will reduce the overall project expenses when deciding on an acceptable project approach. It should be noted that the potential rehabilitation of watermain within the subdivision would only apply to a portion of the watermain within the subdivision. Therefore, the fiscal impact of this option would not be expected to be substantial.

Option 3

The White Pines Civic Association requested that the County also examine an option that includes taking over the water system, construction of a ground level tank and pumping station, replacement or relining of the same pipes as shown by Bensenville. A detailed preliminary cost estimate has been attached for consideration. The following summarizes our estimates and key considerations for the residents of White Pines.

- As detailed in Option #1, the County has assumed the full replacement of all watermain within the White Pines Subdivision for a comparison to the Village of Bensenville option. Consideration of relining alternatives would occur during the final design phase of the project.

- A ground level tank was requested for this alternative by the White Pines Civic Association. Until very detailed system modeling, site selection, topographic survey and system demands are determined during final design, a standard elevated storage tank was assumed.
- The total DuPage County cost estimate for this option was determined to be \$10,862,555. After factoring in the \$900,000 contribution from the Bensenville Unincorporated Utility Fund, the total cost to the residents of White Pines would be approximately \$10 Million.
- It should be noted that approximately \$760,000 of this estimate is related to the estimated 4-year delay in construction that would be required for implementation of this option. This delay is due mainly to the fact that the County would have to initiate the loan process from the beginning with the EPA. In addition, this option requires a lengthy process from the Illinois Department of Natural Resources to receive Lake Michigan allocation rights.
- Assuming that the County can be approved for the low-interest loan from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, a 3.25% interest rate will be incorporated into the cost estimates due to the four year delay in the project. This is higher than the currently projected 2.21% interest rate quoted by the Village of Bensenville. The interest rate fluctuates on a yearly basis and has been on an upward trend over the past several years.
- A total project cost of \$9,962,555, with a 3.25% interest rate for a 20-year loan, would result in a total loan payment (principal plus interest) of \$13,755,777. Considering the 262 homes currently connected to the water service, this would result in a yearly total obligation for the 262 homes of \$687,789. Each home would be responsible for a payment of \$2,625 for the next 20 years, or \$219 per month for the loan repayment.
- Option #3 allows the County to purchase Lake Michigan water directly from the DuPage Water Commission.
- The estimated DuPage County water bill incorporating the completion of Option #3 has been prepared and shown below. It should be understood that the value shown represents a bi-monthly water charge amount as the County bills customers every two months. All rates shown are current DuPage County rates and are subject to change. The Village of Bensenville will still own, operate and bill for sanitary sewer service within the White Pines Subdivision. The sanitary sewer charge is not included in the chart below.

Summary

This letter has detailed two possible water service alternatives that include the participation by DuPage County. Each option fully replaces the water pipes within the White Pines Subdivision. Option #1 allows DuPage County to receive their water from Bensenville, while Option #3 allows DuPage County to receive their water from the DuPage Water Commission. Residents should fully understand that both of these options are significantly more expensive then the option being presented by the Village of Bensenville. Ultimately, the DuPage County options will cost the White Pines residents more money on a monthly basis then the Village of Bensenville option. In addition, the process of watermain replacement within the White Pines Subdivision would be significantly delayed while the County pursues financing from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency.

Should the residents of White Pines wish to pursue one of the listed DuPage County options, a petition will be required to be signed from a clear majority of the homeowners within the subdivision requesting that the County move forward with a specific option. If the Civic Association is interested in pursuing a petition, the County would request that we assist in the development of the wording for the petition. It will be necessary that the petition include the costs and conditions outlined in this letter. Once the petition is submitted to the County, it will then be presented to the Public Works Committee and County Board for consideration of project approval.



Dear Ms. Mellenthin:

I am in receipt of your September 5th letter officially requesting three distinct DuPage County water service options for consideration by the residents of White Pines Subdivision. The requested service options were as follows (directly quoted from your letter):

Option 1 – A straight “apples to apples” proposal with DuPage taking over the system after full replacement of all water lines and purchasing water from one of our bordering municipalities.

This option includes complete replacement of all lines within the White Pines Subdivision by DuPage County with the water being supplied by the Village of Bensenville to DuPage County.

Option 2 – DuPage takes over the system, replaces, relines, directionally bores or a combination of all water lines and purchases water from one of our bordering municipalities.

This option was not analyzed as it is not possible to determine the viability of rehabilitation of pipes prior to final design.

Option 3 – DuPage takes over the system, constructs a ground level tank and pumping station, replaces, relines, directionally bores or a combination of all water lines and purchases water from the Water Commission for our use.

This option includes the complete replacement of all lines within the White Pines Subdivision by DuPage County, construction of a water tower and metering station. The water will be supplied to DuPage County directly from the Water Commission.

The following summarizes our preliminary findings and cost estimates for each of the requested options.

Option 1

The County assumed identical replacement of pipes as shown by Bensenville. This option was completed in order to show a direct comparison to the Village of Bensenville construction estimate for the watermain replacement project in the White Pines Subdivision. A detailed preliminary cost estimate has been attached for consideration. The following summarizes our estimates and key considerations for the residents of White Pines.

- Pipes will be replaced within the White Pines Subdivision as outlined by the Village of Bensenville option.
- The total DuPage County cost estimate for this option was determined to be \$7,388,062. After factoring in the \$900,000 contribution from the Bensenville Unincorporated Utility Fund, the total cost to the residents of White Pines would be approximately \$6.5 Million.
- It should be noted that approximately \$400,000 of this estimate is related to the estimated 3-year delay in construction that would be required for implementation of this option. This delay is due mainly to the fact that the County would have to initiate the loan process from the beginning with the EPA.
- Assuming that the County can be approved for the low-interest loan from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, a 3.00% interest rate will be incorporated into the cost estimates due to the three year delay in the project. This is higher than the currently projected 2.21% interest rate quoted by the Village of Bensenville. The interest rate fluctuates on a yearly basis and has been on an upward trend over the past several years.
- A total project cost of \$6,488,062, with a 3.00% interest rate for a 20-year loan, would result in a total loan payment (principal plus interest) of \$8,722,000. Considering the 262 homes currently connected to the water service, this would result in a yearly total obligation for the 262 homes of \$436,100. Each home would be responsible for a payment of \$1,664 for the next 20 years, or \$138.71 per month for the loan repayment.
- Residents of White Pines should be aware that this option requires that the County purchase water from a local provider. The County anticipates that Bensenville would likely be the only feasible local provider of the Lake Michigan Water. Obtaining water from other providers would likely add considerable expense to the total project cost, as infrastructure would need to be extended into the subdivision to supply the water. This issue will be further examined during final design.
- If an agreement can be negotiated between Bensenville and DuPage County for the supply of water, it would be anticipated that Bensenville would charge a mark-up for the Lake Michigan water delivered through their system to the new DuPage County water system. At this time, a mark-up of \$2.50 per 1,000 gallons was assumed to be charged by the Village of Bensenville. This constitutes approximately a 50% mark-up from the raw Lake Michigan water rates now being charged by the DuPage Water Commission.
- The estimated DuPage County water bill incorporating the completion of Option #1 has been prepared and shown below. It should be understood that the value shown represents a bi-monthly water charge amount as the County bills customers every two months. All rates shown are current DuPage County rates and are subject to change. The Village of Bensenville will still own, operate and bill for sanitary sewer service within the White Pines Subdivision. The sanitary sewer charge is not included in the chart below.

Option 2

The White Pines Civic Association requested that the County examine an option that incorporates a combination of system replacement, relining and directional boring of all water lines within the subdivision as well as the purchase of water from one of the bordering municipalities. The County was not able to complete this option analysis as it requires in-depth analysis of the condition of the existing water system. This level of value engineering typically occurs during the final design phase of a project when detailed condition assessments can be completed.

It should be understood that the County will not allow rear-yard watermain to remain in place. All watermain located within the rear-yard easements will be required to be reconstructed in front of the houses in the right-of-way of the streets. Existing pipes within the road right-of-way would be assessed during the design phase of the project for overall condition, pipe integrity, pipe type and conveyance capacity. Options including relining would then be considered if the pipe is deemed to be in acceptable condition.

Residents should not assume that the relining of pipes will be a feasible alternative that will reduce the overall project expenses when deciding on an acceptable project approach. It should be noted that the potential rehabilitation of watermain within the subdivision would only apply to a portion of the watermain within the subdivision. Therefore, the fiscal impact of this option would not be expected to be substantial.

Option 3

The White Pines Civic Association requested that the County also examine an option that includes taking over the water system, construction of a ground level tank and pumping station, replacement or relining of the same pipes as shown by Bensenville. A detailed preliminary cost estimate has been attached for consideration. The following summarizes our estimates and key considerations for the residents of White Pines.

- As detailed in Option #1, the County has assumed the full replacement of all watermain within the White Pines Subdivision for a comparison to the Village of Bensenville option. Consideration of relining alternatives would occur during the final design phase of the project.

- A ground level tank was requested for this alternative by the White Pines Civic Association. Until very detailed system modeling, site selection, topographic survey and system demands are determined during final design, a standard elevated storage tank was assumed.
- The total DuPage County cost estimate for this option was determined to be \$10,862,555. After factoring in the \$900,000 contribution from the Bensenville Unincorporated Utility Fund, the total cost to the residents of White Pines would be approximately \$10 Million.
- It should be noted that approximately \$760,000 of this estimate is related to the estimated 4-year delay in construction that would be required for implementation of this option. This delay is due mainly to the fact that the County would have to initiate the loan process from the beginning with the EPA. In addition, this option requires a lengthy process from the Illinois Department of Natural Resources to receive Lake Michigan allocation rights.
- Assuming that the County can be approved for the low-interest loan from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, a 3.25% interest rate will be incorporated into the cost estimates due to the four year delay in the project. This is higher than the currently projected 2.21% interest rate quoted by the Village of Bensenville. The interest rate fluctuates on a yearly basis and has been on an upward trend over the past several years.
- A total project cost of \$9,962,555, with a 3.25% interest rate for a 20-year loan, would result in a total loan payment (principal plus interest) of \$13,755,777. Considering the 262 homes currently connected to the water service, this would result in a yearly total obligation for the 262 homes of \$687,789. Each home would be responsible for a payment of \$2,625 for the next 20 years, or \$219 per month for the loan repayment.
- Option #3 allows the County to purchase Lake Michigan water directly from the DuPage Water Commission.
- The estimated DuPage County water bill incorporating the completion of Option #3 has been prepared and shown below. It should be understood that the value shown represents a bi-monthly water charge amount as the County bills customers every two months. All rates shown are current DuPage County rates and are subject to change. The Village of Bensenville will still own, operate and bill for sanitary sewer service within the White Pines Subdivision. The sanitary sewer charge is not included in the chart below.

Summary

This letter has detailed two possible water service alternatives that include the participation by DuPage County. Each option fully replaces the water pipes within the White Pines Subdivision. Option #1 allows DuPage County to receive their water from Bensenville, while Option #3 allows DuPage County to receive their water from the DuPage Water Commission. Residents should fully understand that both of these options are significantly more expensive than the option being presented by the Village of Bensenville. Ultimately, the DuPage County options will cost the White Pines residents more money on a monthly basis than the Village of Bensenville option. In addition, the process of watermain replacement within the White Pines Subdivision would be significantly delayed while the County pursues financing from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency.

Should the residents of White Pines wish to pursue one of the listed DuPage County options, a petition will be required to be signed from a clear majority of the homeowners within the subdivision requesting that the County move forward with a specific option. If the Civic Association is interested in pursuing a petition, the County would request that we assist in the development of the wording for the petition. It will be necessary that the petition include the costs and conditions outlined in this letter. Once the petition is submitted to the County, it will then be presented to the Public Works Committee and County Board for consideration of project approval.

The consultant has spent most the winter months collecting survey data, soil borings, and utility information in order to complete preliminary layout plans for the design. The Village and County recently had a brief kickoff meeting that reviewed the preliminary layout of the area and re-emphasized the importance of evaluating alternative replacement measures based on the criteria mentioned above. We are currently awaiting this analysis from the consultant and hope to have another meeting in the coming weeks. We have been requested by members of the White Pines Civic Association (WPCA) to have representation at our meetings. We will be extending an invitation to the WPCA to attend our next meeting once a date is known.

At this time, the engineers are also proceeding with the design of the system isolation. This system isolation is also being designed and evaluated from both functionality as well as cost effectiveness. We are confident that both the Village and County will agree on a final scope of work for the Water System Rehabilitation Project. This system isolation is also being designed and evaluated from both functionality as well as cost effectiveness. Several measures have already been incorporated into this design to reduce the overall cost of this portion of the project.

As we continue to move forward with the design we will provide progress updates and information relevant to the residents in the area. We are confident that both the Village and County will agree on a final scope of work for the Water System Rehabilitation Project. Once the scope is determined, we will then present the updated design options, cost estimates and project timelines to the residents of White Pines.





Dear White Pines Resident:

The White Pines Civic Association officially requested that DuPage County provide several alternatives for water service within the White Pines Subdivision. A copy of this September 5th letter has been attached for your reference. In response to this request, the Public Works Department prepared several option evaluations for the resident's consideration. A copy of our option analysis has also been included with this letter.

Our department was able to provide preliminary estimates for two of the requested water service alternatives. In both of these options, DuPage County would fully replace the water lines within the subdivision and would be the water service provider. The main difference between the two options presented is that with Option 1 the county would purchase the water from Bensenville while in Option 3 the county would purchase the water directly from the Water Commission.

It should be noted that both options being presented are maximum cap numbers. As stated within the letter to the White Pines Civic Association, both of the DuPage County service options are more expensive than the Village of Bensenville service alternative. This is due primarily to the fact that if the residents select DuPage County as the service provider, the project will be delayed several years as the financing, permits and required intergovernmental agreements are secured.

Should the residents of White Pines wish to pursue one of the listed DuPage County options, a petition will be required to be signed from a clear majority of the homeowners within the subdivision requesting that the County move forward with a specific option. If residents are interested in pursuing a petition, the county would request that we assist in the development of the wording for the petition. It will be necessary that the petition include the costs and conditions of a specific option. Once the petition is submitted, it will then be presented to the Public Works Committee and County Board for consideration of project approval.



Dear Ms. Mellenthin:

I am in receipt of your September 5th letter officially requesting three distinct DuPage County water service options for consideration by the residents of White Pines Subdivision. The requested service options were as follows (directly quoted from your letter):

Option 1 – A straight “apples to apples” proposal with DuPage taking over the system after full replacement of all water lines and purchasing water from one of our bordering municipalities.

This option includes complete replacement of all lines within the White Pines Subdivision by DuPage County with the water being supplied by the Village of Bensenville to DuPage County.

Option 2 – DuPage takes over the system, replaces, relines, directionally bores or a combination of all water lines and purchases water from one of our bordering municipalities.

This option was not analyzed as it is not possible to determine the viability of rehabilitation of pipes prior to final design.

Option 3 – DuPage takes over the system, constructs a ground level tank and pumping station, replaces, relines, directionally bores or a combination of all water lines and purchases water from the Water Commission for our use.

This option includes the complete replacement of all lines within the White Pines Subdivision by DuPage County, construction of a water tower and metering station. The water will be supplied to DuPage County directly from the Water Commission.

The following summarizes our preliminary findings and cost estimates for each of the requested options.

Option 1

The County assumed identical replacement of pipes as shown by Bensenville. This option was completed in order to show a direct comparison to the Village of Bensenville construction estimate for the watermain replacement project in the White Pines Subdivision. A detailed preliminary cost estimate has been attached for consideration. The following summarizes our estimates and key considerations for the residents of White Pines.

- Pipes will be replaced within the White Pines Subdivision as outlined by the Village of Bensenville option.
- The total DuPage County cost estimate for this option was determined to be \$7,388,062. After factoring in the \$900,000 contribution from the Bensenville Unincorporated Utility Fund, the total cost to the residents of White Pines would be approximately \$6.5 Million.
- It should be noted that approximately \$400,000 of this estimate is related to the estimated 3-year delay in construction that would be required for implementation of this option. This delay is due mainly to the fact that the County would have to initiate the loan process from the beginning with the EPA.
- Assuming that the County can be approved for the low-interest loan from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, a 3.00% interest rate will be incorporated into the cost estimates due to the three year delay in the project. This is higher than the currently projected 2.21% interest rate quoted by the Village of Bensenville. The interest rate fluctuates on a yearly basis and has been on an upward trend over the past several years.
- A total project cost of \$6,488,062, with a 3.00% interest rate for a 20-year loan, would result in a total loan payment (principal plus interest) of \$8,722,000. Considering the 262 homes currently connected to the water service, this would result in a yearly total obligation for the 262 homes of \$436,100. Each home would be responsible for a payment of \$1,664 for the next 20 years, or \$138.71 per month for the loan repayment (\$277.42 bi-monthly).
- Residents of White Pines should be aware that this option requires that the County purchase water from a local provider. The County anticipates that Bensenville would likely be the only feasible local provider of the Lake Michigan Water. Obtaining water from other providers would likely add considerable expense to the total project cost, as infrastructure would need to be extended into the subdivision to supply the water. This issue will be further examined during final design.
- If an agreement can be negotiated between Bensenville and DuPage County for the supply of water, it would be anticipated that Bensenville would charge a mark-up for the Lake Michigan water delivered through their system to the new DuPage County water system. At this time, a mark-up of \$2.50 per 1,000 gallons was assumed to be charged by the Village of Bensenville. This constitutes approximately a 50% mark-up from the raw Lake Michigan water rates now being charged by the DuPage Water Commission.
- The estimated DuPage County water bill incorporating the completion of Option #1 has been prepared and shown below. It should be understood that the value shown represents a bi-monthly water charge amount as the County bills customers every two months. All rates shown are current DuPage County rates and are subject to change. The Village of Bensenville will still own, operate and bill for sanitary sewer service within the White Pines Subdivision. The sanitary sewer charge is not included in the chart below.

Option 2

The White Pines Civic Association requested that the County examine an option that incorporates a combination of system replacement, relining and directional boring of all water lines within the subdivision as well as the purchase of water from one of the bordering municipalities. The County was not able to complete this option analysis as it requires in-depth analysis of the condition of the existing water system. This level of value engineering typically occurs during the final design phase of a project when detailed condition assessments can be completed.

It should be understood that the County will not allow rear-yard watermain to remain in place. All watermain located within the rear-yard easements will be required to be reconstructed in front of the houses in the right-of-way of the streets. Existing pipes within the road right-of-way would be assessed during the design phase of the project for overall condition, pipe integrity, pipe type and conveyance capacity. Options including relining would then be considered if the pipe is deemed to be in acceptable condition.

Residents should not assume that the relining of pipes will be a feasible alternative that will reduce the overall project expenses when deciding on an acceptable project approach. It should be noted that the potential rehabilitation of watermain within the subdivision would only apply to a portion of the watermain within the subdivision. Therefore, the fiscal impact of this option would not be expected to be substantial.

Option 3

The White Pines Civic Association requested that the County also examine an option that includes taking over the water system, construction of a ground level tank and pumping station, replacement or relining of the same pipes as shown by Bensenville. A detailed preliminary cost estimate has been attached for consideration. The following summarizes our estimates and key considerations for the residents of White Pines.

- As detailed in Option #1, the County has assumed the full replacement of all watermain within the White Pines Subdivision for a comparison to the Village of Bensenville option. Consideration of relining alternatives would occur during the final design phase of the project.

- A ground level tank was requested for this alternative by the White Pines Civic Association. Until very detailed system modeling, site selection, topographic survey and system demands are determined during final design, a standard elevated storage tank was assumed.
- The total DuPage County cost estimate for this option was determined to be \$10,862,555. After factoring in the \$900,000 contribution from the Bensenville Unincorporated Utility Fund, the total cost to the residents of White Pines would be approximately \$10 Million.
- It should be noted that approximately \$760,000 of this estimate is related to the estimated 4-year delay in construction that would be required for implementation of this option. This delay is due mainly to the fact that the County would have to initiate the loan process from the beginning with the EPA. In addition, this option requires a lengthy process from the Illinois Department of Natural Resources to receive Lake Michigan allocation rights.
- Assuming that the County can be approved for the low-interest loan from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, a 3.25% interest rate will be incorporated into the cost estimates due to the four year delay in the project. This is higher than the currently projected 2.21% interest rate quoted by the Village of Bensenville. The interest rate fluctuates on a yearly basis and has been on an upward trend over the past several years.
- A total project cost of \$9,962,555, with a 3.25% interest rate for a 20-year loan, would result in a total loan payment (principal plus interest) of \$13,755,777. Considering the 262 homes currently connected to the water service, this would result in a yearly total obligation for the 262 homes of \$687,789. Each home would be responsible for a payment of \$2,625 for the next 20 years, or \$219 per month for the loan repayment (\$438 bi-monthly).
- Option #3 allows the County to purchase Lake Michigan water directly from the DuPage Water Commission.
- The estimated DuPage County water bill incorporating the completion of Option #3 has been prepared and shown below. It should be understood that the value shown represents a bi-monthly water charge amount as the County bills customers every two months. All rates shown are current DuPage County rates and are subject to change. The Village of Bensenville will still own, operate and bill for sanitary sewer service within the White Pines Subdivision. The sanitary sewer charge is not included in the chart below.

Summary

This letter has detailed two possible water service alternatives that include the participation by DuPage County. Each option fully replaces the water pipes within the White Pines Subdivision. Option #1 allows DuPage County to receive their water from Bensenville, while Option #3 allows DuPage County to receive their water from the DuPage Water Commission. **Residents should fully understand that both of these options are significantly more expensive than the option being presented by the Village of Bensenville. Ultimately, the DuPage County options will cost the White Pines residents more money on a monthly basis than the Village of Bensenville option.** In addition, the process of watermain replacement within the White Pines Subdivision would be significantly delayed while the County pursues financing from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency.

Should the residents of White Pines wish to pursue one of the listed DuPage County options, a petition will be required to be signed from a clear majority of the homeowners within the subdivision requesting that the County move forward with a specific option. If the Civic Association is interested in pursuing a petition, the County would request that we assist in the development of the wording for the petition. It will be necessary that the petition include the costs and conditions outlined in this letter. Once the petition is submitted to the County, it will then be presented to the Public Works Committee and County Board for consideration of project approval.

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



I apologize for the delay in the response, but the following are answers to your questions:

1. *Could you provide us with a step-by-step procedure for what needs to happen if we'd prefer the county to do the SSA for our:*
 - a. *Water infrastructure replacement only? Approximate cost?*
 - b. *Complete water system with water tower, lifting station, etc.? Approximate cost?*
 - c. *In each case, could you please include the percentage of residents that you'd like to see on any petitions you would need and what type of cooperation would be needed with the Village of Bensenville to implement each SSA with respect to water and sewer?*

Response: The County's SSA procedure for both of the listed options would be identical. The steps would be as follows:

- 1) The County would require that a petition be submitted from the White Pines residents requesting us to take a particular action on behalf of the residents. This should be concise and be representative of a vast majority of the residents. Keep in mind, this action would not be binding. There is not a specific number that we are looking for, but typically this petition represents 70-80% of the residents. The County can help formulate the wording of this petition but it is typically a request to provide more information about a project.
- 2) Once this petition is received, we will present it to the Public Works Committee for consideration. If given approval, staff will then analyze the project options. This analysis typically includes a project layout and cost estimate.
- 3) The County would then present this information to the residents of White Pines for consideration. A survey that details the SSA expenses for the residents would be distributed to all properties that would potentially be contained within the SSA. At this point the expenses reported to the residents would be maximum cap numbers as detailed engineering would not have been completed.
- 4) Once the results of the survey are received, they will be presented to the Public Works Committee for consideration. The Committee will only move forward with the SSA formation if a majority of the residents respond positively to the survey. Typically, the County likes to see an excess of 65-75% of the residents in favor of a project at this point of the SSA process.
- 5) If sufficient interest exists among the residents for a project and the Public Works Committee recommends approval, the formal SSA formation process would commence with the County Board.
- 6) The formal SSA formation process typically takes 1-4 months to complete (public hearings, advertisements, votes, etc.).
- 7) Once formally approved, the County would then begin the design process associated with the project. It is during this process that the County will engineer the various construction

8) Throughout the design process, the County would complete all required loan/bonding documents and applications. Bidding and construction would then commence once the design process has been completed.

As for the costs of the various projects, these would be determined during the initial project investigation mentioned above. At this point, the numbers being presented by Bensenville are likely the most current numbers.

2. *If Wood Dale were to provide the replacement, what would be your estimate for the above?*

Response: This would not be possible to answer until the initial design is completed. If this were to be a direction that the subdivision wishes to explore, we would then meet with Wood Dale to discuss if they have the ability to serve your area. Such items as existing network capacity, excess storage availability, proximity of existing lines would all have to be examined. At that time, anticipated service fees would also be established by Wood Dale.

3. *If we were to ask "Illinois American Water" to replace our pipes, etc., where would they get our water from--Lake Michigan, community well? Can you please discuss who regulates them and what recourse residents would have if there are problems? What type of cooperation would be needed from the Village to implement this alternative?*

Response: Once again, detailed meetings would be needed with Illinois American Water to determine definitively. However, I would assume that they would supply Lake Michigan water to your subdivision through an agreement with Bensenville. Bensenville would likely sell them the water and then they would sell it to your subdivision. Illinois American would be responsible for the water mains throughout the subdivision. The Illinois Commerce Commission (ICC) regulates Illinois American since they are a private "for profit" company. The avenue that residents have with a private utility would be with the ICC or through private legal filings. The County or the EPA would have no regulatory authority over this organization. In order to make this option feasible, Bensenville would have to do the following: 1) sell or give the current system to Illinois American and 2) agree to sell Lake Michigan water to Illinois American.

4. *What would it take to revisit the items mentioned in Chairman Schillerstrom's 3/12/2010 letter to Village President, Frank Soto, and to possibly restart discussions with respect to the water system infrastructure improvement project?*

Response: I would assume that you are referring to the possibility of the County taking over the White Pines System, forming an SSA to make the needed improvements and purchasing water from Bensenville. If this is the case, then the County would require clear direction from the neighborhood that this is the option that they would like us to further explore. In previous attempts for the County to form an SSA to make the infrastructure repairs, a majority of the residents within the subdivision were not supportive of this concept. As with the other options, Bensenville would need to be highly involved and supportive with this concept.

5. *It has been rumored and publicly stated that members of the White Pines Civic Association Board told County officials, including yourself, that most or all of the residents of the White Pines subdivision were "on-board" or "ok" with annexation by the Village of Bensenville. To your knowledge, in any of your meetings or conversations with Civic Association Board members, has this been stated by them to you or to any County Board members or staff?*

Proposed White Pines Subdivision Water Main And Sanitary Replacement Preliminary Study (Potential Future Special Service Area)

Principal Environmental Engineer Kottmeyer stated that the residents of the White Pines Subdivision submitted a petition to the County of DuPage for assistance with the repair and/or replacement of the water mains and sanitary sewers located within their subdivision. This petition was signed by 173 residents. The White Pines Subdivision is located in unincorporated Bensenville at the southeast corner of the intersection of Third Avenue and Route 83. The residents of this unincorporated area are currently serviced by Bensenville for their utilities. This area of the Bensenville water and sewer system experiences frequent interruptions of service due to water main breaks and sanitary sewer back-ups. These are older systems that are primarily located in the rear of houses that further impacts residents during the repair process. The residents have asked the County of DuPage to work with Bensenville to determine if these systems can be repaired or replaced as part of a potential future special service area.

Due to the large size of the White Pines Subdivision and the unknown condition of their systems, staff proposes to complete a due diligence study of the area to determine a solution and to quantify the cost of this solution. In order to minimize the costs of this study, county staff will complete a majority of the work in-house. However, some components of this study, such as surveying and CAD drafting, will require the services of an outside consulting firm. A contract with Crawford, Murphy & Tilley in the amount of \$14,900 has also been proposed for approval (separate agenda item). Through the course of this preliminary study, staff will work closely with the Village of Bensenville to determine viable alternatives and the associated costs. Upon completion of this study, the results will be presented to the Public Works Committee for consideration of a potential future course of action. It should be noted that any funds expended as part of this study, including staff time, will be recovered if a special service

Sorry about the phone tag these past couple days. I wanted to give you an update on where the Village stands on the White Pines Project.

Village staff met with the White Pines Civic Association Board Members last week. At this meeting the Village presented a very generous annexation proposition to the Board. Basically, the terms of the proposed annexation would include:

1. Court supervised annexation (requiring 51% approval)
2. Village development of Water Main Replacement Project SSA (\$7 million project estimate)
3. Village to utilize approximately \$1 million of unincorporated fund balance
4. Village to split the remaining \$6 million, up to \$3 million for the Project
5. Village to abate property taxes for 5 years
6. "Residents" to pay incorporated water/sewer rates once annexation is complete (which will be before project completion)
7. Properties to remain "legal non-conforming" status with Bensenville
8. White Pines remains "rural" in appearance (ie no sidewalks, open ditches, etc.)
9. Although out of our control, the Fire District indicated that they may be willing to abate the Fire District increase for the 5 years as well

At the conclusion of the meeting, all Board members were in favor of moving forward. Those who came to the meeting never expecting to annex, have changed their minds and called the offer "surprising" and "doable".

As such, we are planning to move forward with an expedited schedule that will include the following:

1. Preliminary "term sheet" to Village Board for review and approval (Nov 25 / Dec 2)

5. Public Hearing on each Annexation Agreement (?)
6. Submit to Circuit Court for Court Order (?)
7. SSA Ordinance Process upon Annexation




Nelson Highview Subdivision (Potential Service Area)




